## One Couldn't Help But Ask...

- 1. Keeping in mind the area of the temple discussed; in addition to acts of trade, i.e., selling animals and collecting temple taxes, what other attitude towards God's house was Jesus cleansing from it?
- 2. What can we say about the apparent contradiction of the ritualistic Passover cleansing required by the temple leaders vs. Jesus' actual act of cleansing?
- 3. Is it reasonable to think that Jesus' action cured the problem? Let's elaborate on our answer.
- 4. David Guzik suggests that Jesus' conversion of water to wine followed by a cleansing of the temple is a pattern of behavior, that is, convert then cleanse. Do you agree and is there some significance in it?

## Takeaways

- 1. Rituals, rules, and adornments of or about a place of worship, the one worshiping or the act of worship are not satisfactory substitutes for the personal relationship desired by Jesus of HIs people.
- 2. Our King is not in need of anything of the world and offering substitutes for our complete life is an insult to the one who gave His life for us.
- 3. The sequence of events described by John is the conversion of water to wine and then a cleansing of the temple. Jesus accepts us as we are and then acts to reform our ways to His.
